Saloni offers the ultimate in large format with Goliat, an anti-slip floor tile measuring 47" x 47". Available in white, bronze, grey, brown and black and fully rectified, Goliat creates an almost seamless, monolithic slab for any commercial space.

The Fonte series in 18" x 36" offers a brushed linen appeal in cream, grey or brown. Accent pieces show the product in alternating waves of uplifted convexes to create three-dimensional visual appeal. For the residential side, Saloni offers the Home series which depicts wood tones.

Saloni recently approached world renowned architectural firm The Rockwell Group about collaborating on the design of a collection of modular tiles for both floor and wall, interior and exterior applications. What emerged was the Connec Collection – a full range of pieces that offer infinite combinations of customized designs and playing well to the individual needs and creativity of the designer.

Recent Project:

Spanish architects Carlos Ferrater and Joan Gibernau designed an eloquent home in Sant Cugat, Barcelona, with a built floor space of 1,000m2. Tiles by Saloni were used to clad both the façade and roof, creating a striking visual impact.

The building stands out for the use of a ventilated façade incorporating 45x90 (17" x 35.4") through-body porcelain tiles from the Vivendi collection by Saloni. With its concealed anchorage system, the façade contributes substantially to the sustainability of the building.

The tile-clad roof adds an eye-catching effect due to the tiles' lightweight versatility. Architects were able to create innovative geometric form that add volume to the building and set it apart. At the same time, practical benefits were ensured due to the porcelain tiles zero water absorption rate which offers first-class insulation whatever the weather while also avoiding noise pollution.

The incorporation of porcelain tiles in ventilated façade systems represents a big step forward in architecture, allowing for the creation of buildings that combine comfort with beauty. They reduce the weight of the façade and thus the structural load, the assembly process is rapid, and the tiles can easily be replaced thanks to their modular format.

Aesthetically they come in a wide variety of colors and surface finishes. Technically they combine low permeability, moisture expansion and thermal expansion with high bending strength. They offer resistance to corrosion, atmospheric agents, frost and ice, staining, and industrial pollution. Porcelain tiles also offer energy-saving and environmental benefits in comparison with other materials because they generate a lower amount of harmful waste and consume fewer raw materials during the manufacturing process.
