

Samoa culture features a nearly extinct art form known as Saipo or Tapa. This cultural symbol features graphic designs imprinted on canvas that is made from the bark of the mulberry tree. Thirteen geometric symbols are used and one called Tusili'i, representing the midrib of the coconut leaf, is composed of small lines. Samoa® is reminiscent of this almost forgotten art form and evokes a sense of tradition and nature in its simplicity and richness of color.
