

Karri Bright/Patina: Batch #15051



Salvaged from a campus of old school buildings in Australia, our reclaimed Karri has the rich look of Mahogany but with a considerably greener footprint and a hardness greater than White Oak. In our Bright grade, we fully surface the material to reveal the wood's smooth tight grain and reddish-brown color tone. In our Patina grade, we leave the original board surface fully intact, preserving the rough saw marks and a brown/grey patina. In both grades, occasional pitch pockets and nail holes add character to the wood.

Source Location: Australia

This batch of material was salvaged from an old school building in Perth, Australia. Historically, Karri wood has been logged and used in construction in Western Australia since the early 19th Century. Because of its rot-resistant properties, the timber was even exported to England for use in railway, telegraph pole and shipbuilding construction. In Australia, it was common for Karri to be used in roofs (as it was in this school) because of its length and scarcity of knots.
